Youth4Music Winnipeg Leadership Symposium

The Youth4Music Program of the Coalition for Music Education is providing youth with a platform to make their voices heard on the importance of music education in their schools and communities. The Coalition is holding symposiums across Canada from Montreal to Vancouver and Cape Breton to Toronto. A Youth4Music Leadership Symposium took place in Winnipeg on Saturday, November 19 at the Manitoba Conservatory of Music & Arts, supported by the Winnipeg Collegiate at the University of Winnipeg. This day long event was hosted by youth-for-youth to share in conversations about the importance of music in Winnipeg. Over 20 students from various junior high, high school, collegiate, and university students came together. They were inspired by speakers and musicians including Lizzy Hoyt, Lindsey White, and James Klassen on the power of music in their lives as a proponent for change. The day also included live music during free jam sessions, food, and networking. The symposium focused on the network's Youth4Music Manifesto; learning, creating, making and valuing music in Canada. The participants discussed why music is important in their community, how it should be valued, and what can be done to carry this action forward. The day was summed up by the inception of a Youth4Music Winnipeg Hub with the election of two co-chairs, Mariam Busari (Winnipeg Collegiate at the University of Winnipeg) and James Atkinson (J.H. Bruns Collegiate). We are in the process of working with our co-chairs to schedule the first Hub meeting to outline priorities for the coming months including supporting Music Monday 2017, more performance spaces for youth under 18 years of age and creating a music resource tool for youth in Winnipeg.



Achieving Equality in Seven Oaks School Division: An Interview with Tyler Yip by Cheri Foster

Seven Oaks School Division is an urban school district located in Winnipeg, Manitoba. There are approximately 11000 K-12 students registered in the division's 23 schools. Band is offered from grades 6-12 in all middle and senior years schools, with 2363 students registered in band programs across the division.

In 2012, Seven Oaks School Division initiated a program called "SOSD" (Seven Oaks School Division). The purpose of this program is to provide band instruments to students free of charge. In 2012, all grade 6 students received instruments, and each school year the next grade is added to the program. They are hopeful by 2018, all band students from grade 6-12 will be supplied with divisionally-owned instruments.

The "SOSD" program is built on the philosophy of equality for all students. Many school communities within the division have sizeable immigrant populations, as well as students who fall into a low socio-economic demographic. Prior to 2012, teachers and administrators reported that many students were not able to participate in band because of the cost to rent or purchase an instrument. The board of superintendents and board of trustees recognized the gap in equality that families faced when enrolling students in band, and deemed it necessary for all students to have equal access to divisionally-owned instruments.

In addition to the purchasing of instruments, Seven Oaks School Division also provides ongoing maintenance for instruments purchased through the "SOSD" program. Teachers are responsible for signing instruments in and out for their students at the beginning and end of the school year and keeping track of instruments which require maintenance. Students and their families are responsible caring for the instrument in accordance with the school's expectations.

As a result of the "SOSD" program, there has been a dramatic increase in band enrollment across the division. Prior to the introduction of the program at the middle years level, two schools reported an average of 55 and 81 students in grade 6 band. In the first year of the program, these same schools increased their enrollment to 80 and 123 students respectively. At the senior years level, three schools reported average grade 9 enrollments of 36, 65, and 60. This year, as the "SOSD" program enters high schools at the grade 9 level, these same schools report grade 9 enrollments of 56, 104, and 111 students respectively. Due to the increase in these numbers, band instruction time has increased across the division. Some teachers who were previously part-time are now full-time. Additional teachers have been hired at some schools, while new beginner band classes for grade 9 students have been added at two senior years schools.

By removing the financial barriers of instrumental music education, more Seven Oaks students are able to join band. Teachers within the division work extremely hard to support the initiative by providing students with quality educational experiences and a wealth of musical opportunities. The commitment to the "SOSD" program from both teachers and senior administration has resulted in the creation of inclusive, vibrant musical communities across the school division.

14 THE MCO PERFORMS WITH THE FRONTIER FIDDLERS, FEBRUARY 14

Made up of students in the Frontier School Division, the Frontier Fiddlers represents *la crème de la crème* of young fiddle players in the province. They come from as far away as Grand Rapids, Matheson Island, Berens River, and Norway House. They play Red River jigs with breakneck speed. And all of them are teenagers or younger.

At this concert, the Frontier Fiddlers will treat us to a spectacular medley of fiddle tunes with a Red River flavour. With the orchestra, they'll also perform selections from Bartók and Bach, and a folk-inspired new work by favourite Winnipeg composer Jim Hiscott.

2 MCO, THÉÂTRE CERCLE MOLIÈRE — MUSIC AND THEATRE, JUNE 7 AND 8

Nanabush is the trickster figure of Anishinaabe mythology—a cultural hero who, according to legend, is responsible for dogs' proclivity to sniff one another's tails and for rescuing the forest from Paul Bunyan.

Nanabush and the Drum/Nanabozho et le tambour, a music and theatre collaboration between the MCO and Théâtre Cercle Molière, envisions Nanabush's role in the foundation of the Métis. He sets up playful obstacles for a hapless French voyageur, as he attempts to navigate the land and woo his more savvy Indigenous love interest.

While celebrating Canada's 150th birthday, the piece illuminates the diversity of our heritage with a sense of humour and spectacle. The work is bilingual, but accessible to French and English students equally.

ADVOCATE FOR YOUR MUSIC PROGRAM!

MOC is here to help support you as you advocate for your music programs! Here are some things to consider as you get started.

SING: Get the word out!

<u>School Newsletter:</u> Share facts with parents about music and the importance of music in schools. Let parents know about your program and the benefits of it.

<u>Take home lessons</u>: Create lessons/ Orff activities that students can take home and teach their parents. Let families experience the Orff process together. You may also decide to do this during parent/teacher interviews.

MOVE: Connect with other music educators!

Attend PD sessions: PD sessions are not just a chance to advance your own learning, knowledge, and wealth of resources. They are also a great chance to get to know other music educators in your division, surrounding regions, province, and country.

<u>Partner up:</u> Team up with local choirs, music groups, or other school music programs. You may also think about teaming up with classroom teachers and connect subjects in class to your music lessons.

<u>Share ideas:</u> MOC has a Facebook page that makes it easy to connect with other music educators across the province. Share your ideas and seek advice from educators just like yourself in similar situations.

CREATE: Make a plan!

<u>Plan and stick with it:</u> Once you know what your personal advocacy goals are for the year, make a plan of how you will work towards them. Like anything else, it may take time to build the support you would like to see. Be patient and keep at it!

PLAY: Have fun!

<u>Orff is fun:</u> Remember that students learn best when they are having fun. Don't be afraid to get a little silly with them and let them see that you too are having fun.


